General Information

Location and Environment:

Capay Joint Union Elementary School District serves the educational needs of the rural community of Orland, California, located at 7504 Cutting Ave, 95963. Nestled amidst almond orchards and expansive grazing lands, our school offers picturesque views of the Sierra Nevada, Mt. Lassen, and Mt. Shasta, providing a tranquil and inspiring learning environment. Our community's robust agricultural focus influences many aspects of district life, as many students and their families are directly involved in farming.

School Composition:

The district comprises Capay Joint Union Elementary School, catering to students from transitional kindergarten through eighth grade, including two extensive needs special education programs managed by the Glenn County Office of Education. With an enrollment of 186 students, our demographics are 60% White and 40% Hispanic, with 12% identified as English Language Learners, 47% socioeconomically disadvantaged, and 8.6% with disabilities.

Academic Focus:

Our academic approach emphasizes excellence in education, with a commitment to highly qualified teachers, 1:1 technology access, and robust instruction in Math and English Language Arts (ELA). We prioritize identifying and addressing educational gaps through the implementation of diagnostic tests in ELA, Math, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL), conducted three times annually to tailor instructional strategies effectively.

Extracurricular and Support Programs:

A vibrant after-school program extends learning opportunities beyond the classroom, offering homework assistance, enrichment activities, and a nurturing space for fun and social interaction. This program is essential in supporting our students' educational and social development.

Staff and Facilities:

Our dedicated team consists of 9 teachers and 8 instructional aides, trained in innovative educational tools such as i-Ready, Satchel Pulse (SEL), and Project Arise (science of reading-based practices). The school's facilities, partially modernized three to four years ago, include specialized rooms for Art and Music/SEL, alongside a library that serves as a focal point for literacy and community engagement.

Community Integration:

The district is deeply integrated with the local community, serving as a central hub for various local events. We maintain a strong partnership with the Capay Rancho Women's Club, whose members contribute significantly through volunteering in our library and assisting at school events throughout the year.

Vision for the Future:

Looking ahead, Capay Joint Union Elementary School District is committed to continuous improvement and innovation in education, ensuring that every student has the tools and support needed to succeed in an ever-evolving world. We are dedicated to furthering facility updates and expanding our educational programs to meet and exceed the needs of all students.

Reflecting on CJUESD's annual performance based on the California School Dashboard and local data reveals notable improvements in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics, graduation rates, and college/career readiness. Enhanced communication through tools like SchoolWise, Thrillshare, and the Remind app has significantly increased engagement with parents and the community. However, achievement gaps among subgroups such as English Learners (EL), low-income students, and students with disabilities remain, and while suspension rates have decreased slightly, further efforts are needed to support Socio-Economically Disadvantaged (SED) students. Local data highlights the success of initiatives like supplemental reading materials and targeted ELA interventions, suggesting that ongoing, data-driven strategies and community involvement will be crucial in maintaining and accelerating progress.

The adopted Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) reflects a comprehensive and inclusive approach, significantly influenced by the valuable feedback provided by our educational partners. This collaborative process has underscored our strengths as a tight-knit school community and emphasized the importance of embracing partnerships with local groups such as the Capay Rancho Women's Club.

One of the critical areas of focus is the increased support for our English Learners (ELs) and their development. Based on feedback from stakeholders, we have dedicated additional resources to enhance language acquisition programs, ensuring that our EL students receive tailored and effective instruction. This includes professional development for teachers to better serve our EL population and integrating strategies that promote language development across all subject areas.

Creating a safe and supportive campus environment remains a top priority. Feedback from parents, students, and staff highlighted the necessity of maintaining a secure and welcoming school climate. In response, the LCAP includes measures to bolster campus security, enhance mental health services, and promote positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS).

Engaging opportunities for students are essential for fostering a love of learning and promoting overall student success. Our community's input has driven the development of diverse extracurricular programs, including arts, sports, and STEM activities, ensuring that every student has access to enriching experiences that align with their interests and talents.

Supporting our teaching staff in providing data-driven instruction is a cornerstone of our strategy to improve ELA and Math outcomes. Professional development and collaborative planning time have been prioritized, enabling teachers to utilize data effectively to inform instruction and meet the individual needs of students. This focus on data-driven practices is expected to yield significant improvements in student achievement in both ELA and Math.

Overall, the adopted LCAP is a testament to the power of community collaboration and the unwavering commitment to creating a thriving educational environment for all students. By leveraging our strengths and addressing the specific needs identified by our educational partners, we are poised to achieve our goals and continue providing high-quality education in our district.

The goal was developed in response to the needs identified through data analysis and input from educational partners.

The analysis of California School Dashboard (Dashboard) data indicated a clear need to continue supporting English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and English Language Development (ELD). For Example:

- 41.96% of all students in grades 3-8 met or exceeded standard in English Language Arts on the Smarter Balanced assessments. However, only 35.27% of low income student met or exceeded standard.
- 34.62% of all students in grades 3-8 met or exceeded standard in Mathematics on the Smarter Balanced assessments. However, only 22.91% of low income student met or exceeded standard.

During the LCAP development process, educational partners identified the need for:

- Ongoing instructional support for ELA, Math, and ELD
- Increased collaboration time for teachers
- Assistance to low-income and English Learner families in understanding the online tools and Student Information System (Schoolwise) so they can better support their students at home
- Expanded learning opportunities for students who are low-income, English Learners and Foster Youth
- · Access to reading materials for low-income students to be used at home






